


Marown Primary School

Adventure Playground:

We are so very excited about our new Adventure Playground / outdoor play equipment. The children have had an assembly about safety and have also been shown how to safely use the equipment. Parking / Congestion:

We have had concerns raised by local residents of the dangers the queues of traffic building up near to the junction on the road outside school. I urge you to walk to school to drop off and collect your children if possible, to alleviate the traffic pressures outside.

When parking your cars outside, please be aware of the new railings that have been put up parallel to the school building at the back of the playground.

Parent Helpers:

If you are able to give up any regular time to help in school to bake or hear readers etc., please contact your child's class teacher. We do expect all regular volunteers to have a police check.

P.E. / Swimming (for Y3-Y6):

Please ensure that your child has his/her full P.E. kit in school every day. It will be sent home at the end of every half term to be washed and returned. Please make sure that **all items of clothing**, even pumps, are labelled. It is much easier to return jumpers when they are named.

There have been some changes to the swimming timetable and Marown will commence lessons in February. You will receive further information about swimming nearer the time. If you are able to help, please contact your child's class teacher. We do expect all regular volunteers to have a police check.

Golden Time / Wet Play Games:

Classes are always on the lookout for games, books, colouring in books and lego to play with during the unstructured times of the day. If you have any that are in good condition, please do pass these to our class teachers.
